***Concept note:** explain your idea in 2 to 3 sentences.

📦 Materials to be used

Magazines, newspapers, any waste item that suits your design for example the caps of plastic bottles, metallic or cork caps of glass bottles, pieces of broken porcelain plate, fabrics as jeans or others, metallic wires, any package wrapping like chips or chocolate etc.

You can use organic material from nature such as leaves, branches, stones etc.

It's preferable not to use plastic flowers, non-reusable plastic plates, forks, spoons or cups!

You can include some hand drawing to your poster like doodling with pen and ink, typography, and illustration.

Deliver your students projects to the nearest MUBS campus max by April 4th

On the back of the poster, include the name of the student, age, class and school name.

Benefits

- ★ All contestants will get an e-Certificate of Participation
- ★ Top 10 of each category will get a Certificate of Merit
- ★ The Winners will be announced as MUBS “SDG Student Ambassador”
- ★ Top 20 Posters will be displayed during the ceremony

Prizes

The winners will be revealed during the Ceremony. A total of **12 prizes** will be awarded, with **3 prizes** for each category. The first, second, and third prizes in each category will include **scholarships** and **cash awards**.

Judging

Judging Process

The judging process Anonymous where the students' projects will have a code and will not bear the name of the student or their respective school

Every Judge will assess every project remotely and on an individual basis.
The judge will select «**Satisfactory**» or «**Unsatisfactory**» based on projects' concept notes and pictures uploaded by students

Every project that will get «**Satisfactory**» grades from more than half of the total number of judges will be shortlisted to the second round of judging

All the judges will meet to evaluate the shortlisted projects. Winners will be selected based on detailed grading, discussions and deliberation
